# **PreK3 READINESS**

The **skills** listed below demonstrate a child's readiness for PreK3.

#### **Social Skills**

- Engaging in parallel play with peers
- Taking turns during activities
- Beginning to understand sharing

# Language & Literacy

- Using simple sentences to express needs and wants
- Naming familiar objects and people
- Following simple instructions
- Beginning to recognize some letters

#### **Mathematics**

- Counting to 10
- Recognizing and naming basic colors as well as simple shapes

# **Fine Motor Skills**

- Holding and using crayons and markers
- Building with blocks and playing with other toys appropriately
- Beginning to use scissors with assistance
- Gripping toys
- Able to work materials with different textures such as squishy, sandy, wet, and slimy

#### **Gross Motor Skills**

- Walking and running with improved coordination
- Climbing on playground equipment
- Kicking and throwing a ball

# **Self Help Skills**

- Being able to separate from parents
- Fully potty-trained by taking care of toileting needs independently



#### **Fine Motor Skills**

- Using scissors to cut along a line
- Tracing and writing letters and numbers
- Holding a pencil or crayon with proper grip

#### **Gross Motor Skills**

- · Walking in a straight line
- Hopping, skipping, and jumping
- Participating in organized games and activities

## Self Help Skills

- Managing personal belongings independently
- Using the restroom and washing hands without assistance
- Opening snacks and lunch containers on their own
